Michigan, Nebraska and Ohio have the most registered military families or wounded/disabled veterans in the program.



In 2014-15 the top three cities with populations over 100,000 with the most snowfall were Worcester, Mass. 119.7 in., Syracuse, N.Y. 119.1 in. and Lowell, Mass. 118.6 in.



The first snow plow was pulled by horses in Milwaukee in **1862**.



A blizzard is defined by winds exceeding **35 mph**, falling or blowing snow and less than **25 mile** visibility.



The highest recorded one-day snowfall on record in the United States was **63 inches** (5 ft. 3 in.) in Georgetown, Colorado in December 1913.
