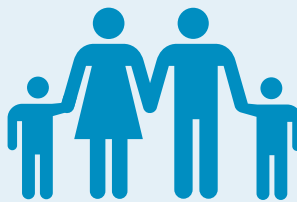


SnowCare for Troops currently has more than **1,300 registered volunteer contractors**.

The number of military families and wounded or disabled veterans that have registered for **SnowCare for Troops** since the program's inception.



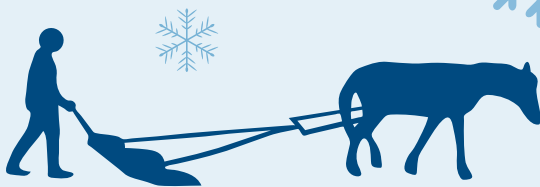
Michigan, Nebraska and Ohio have the **most registered military families or wounded/disabled veterans** in the program.



Michigan recorded **181 inches of snow** in 2014-15.



In 2014-15 the top three cities with populations over 100,000 with the most snowfall were Worcester, Mass. **119.7 in.**, Syracuse, N.Y. **119.1 in.** and Lowell, Mass. **118.6 in.**



The first snow plow was pulled by horses in Milwaukee in **1862**.



A blizzard is defined by winds exceeding **35 mph**, falling or blowing snow and less than **25 mile** visibility.
